- 5 Manage the financial assets of the RWC Foundation




Message from the Chair of the Foundation Board

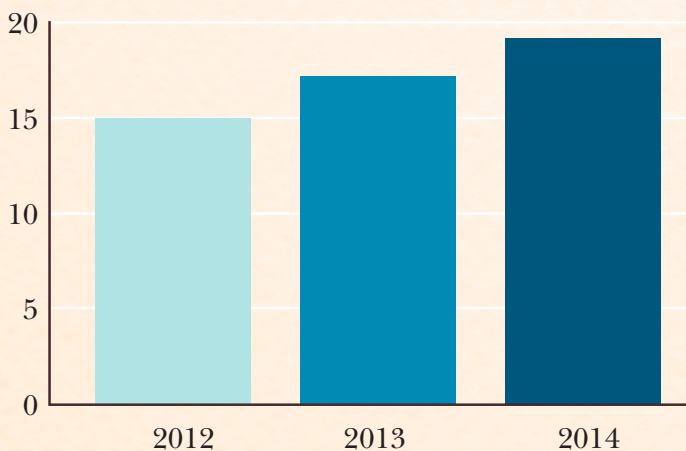
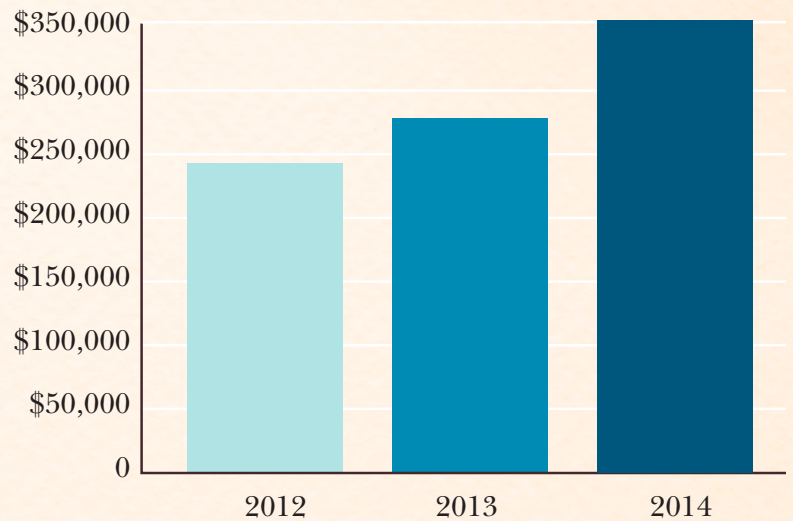

In this 30th Anniversary edition of the RWC Foundation Annual Report, I want to extend my thanks to all Foundation Board members past and present for their efforts in securing gifts and grants that have made it possible for RWC to grow over the past three decades and meet the changing needs and desires of its residents.

Our annual Fellowship Fund Drive and the golf tournament continue to be principal sources of revenue for the Foundation, and I want to thank everyone who contributed their time, talent, and treasure to these efforts. Present at the Creation...

As RWC celebrates its thirtieth anniversary, two members of the staff will look back on the growth of the community with a special sense of pride. Lillian George, office manager in RWC's Resident Clinic, and Genita Maiden-Shearin, Dining Services Production Manager, have been at RWC since the community opened in 1985.

George, who was working for local physicians in 1985, saw the cottages, apartments and health center rise above the tiny trees along Irvington Road. She was hired that year as the Clinic's first office manager, and has held the same job for thirty years. In the early days, state-of-the-art technology meant an electric typewriter and later a computer and massive printer that made so much noise it was impossible to carry on a telephone conversation while it operated. The Windmill Point resident and mother of two (youngsters in 1985, now 42 and 34) remembers when the Wellness Center consisted of a rowing machine and four bicycles.

In 1985 Maiden-Shearin was a young single mother of two working at the BP station in town. A friend brought her an application and encouraged her to apply for a position at the new community out near Irvington. She was hired as a cook the day after she applied, and subsequently advanced to cook supervisor and manager before becoming production manager. Working at RWC has allowed her to send both her children to college. To help RWC celebrate its anniversary, Maiden-Shearin helped organize a celebration service in May.

George and Maiden-Shearin have seen RWC adapt to meet the changing needs of residents, adding new facilities and services. What hasn't changed, they insist, is the commitment to care that stands at the heart of RWC's mission.

A Tradition Like No Other in the Northern Neck

It may not be the Master's, but RWC's annual golf tournament traces its heritage back a long way – in fact, it predates the opening of RWC. While construction was still underway, a group interested in helping the community decided to organize a golf tournament.

The original organizers may not have realized that their initiative would continue for more than thirty years. But every spring foursomes play on a local course to raise money for the RWC Foundation's Fellowship Fund. The array of prizes may be an attraction for some, but most who participate are happy to be assisting RWC to carry out its mission of providing a high-quality living environment for all of its residents.

The long-time success of the tournament is due in large part to a cadre of volunteers who donate their time and talent to organizing the event. For much of the tournament's history, the man at the center of those efforts was Ed French. A veteran of World War II and a 1947 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, Ed was a longtime executive at United States Steel. He served on the RWC Board of Directors for five years. Ed passed away in December 2014, but the tournament he helped to start in 1985 continues.

Thanks to the efforts of Ed and other volunteers, and the strong support of local businesses and individuals, residents whose funds have become exhausted despite prudent planning can be assured that they can remain a part of the RWC community.

Building for the Next Thirty Years... and more...

Rappahannock Westminster-Canterbury plans to construct a new Wellness Center. The 17,000 square-foot building will be located near the Chesapeake Center and apartments in the RWC neighborhood.

The larger facility will accommodate the many residents and community participants who are active in RWC's wellness programs. Though well equipped, the current fitness center cannot accommodate the needs of residents and the members of the local community who participate in RWC's programs. Currently 80% of residents participate in some form of wellness activity. More than twenty fitness classes are held at RWC each week. RWC is known nationally for the high participation rate of residents in its

wellness programs, and has been recognized by the International Council on Active Aging.

Residents and staff will be consulted so that the amenities in the new building match the needs and desires of those most likely to use the center. Preliminary designs include a three-lane pool with an area for aerobic exercise, classroom space for conducting a variety of fitness activities, offices and locker rooms. Wellness and resident life professionals will relocate to the new Wellness Center.

The architectural firm of Guernsey Tingle of Williamsburg, Bay Design Group of Glenss, and Connemara Corporation of White Stone, all of whom have done work previously at RWC, will design and complete the new building.

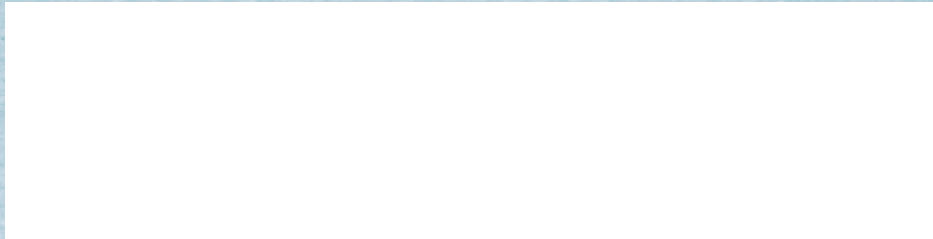
