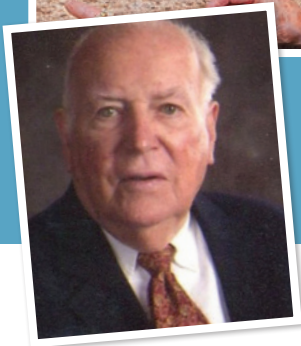
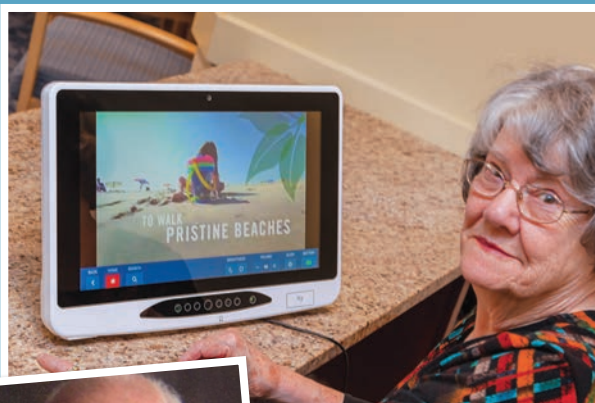

Foundation, the Birdsong Tablet is an easy-to-use technology that brings the world to those who are not about to go out and experience it themselves. This technology is uniquely adapted to senior adults enabling them to engage in activities, re-visit travel experiences, and maintain cognitive and motor skills. You will read about this remarkable value this innovative tool provides to residents, family members, and caregivers. RWC has several Birdsong Tablets throughout the community because of the financial support and inspiring encouragement of the late Mr. Birdsong.

As I think about it, innovation is at the heart of the mission of RWC and the Foundation. The Fellowship Fund is an innovative way to ensure the safety and security of residents who may otherwise not be able to call RWC home. Our Life Enrichment Center and the Small House would not exist without innovative thoughts about wellness and dementia care. ## Economic Impact

Rappahannock Westminister-Canterbury depends upon the gifts and talents of staff members to provide a vast range of care and services for residents and clients, the skills and expertise of local business that provide necessary goods and services, and other local organizations that directly and indirectly support RWC and our residents, clients and staff.

For our fiscal year 2020-2021, our payroll for staff living in the greater Northern Neck community exceeded \$8.4 million with an additional \$1.8 million to staff residing in the Middle Peninsula community.

During the same time period, expenditures on goods, services, and capital assets \$2.1 million in the Northern Neck and exceeded \$356,000 on the Middle Peninsula.

Yes, we do pay taxes as well. Our personal property, real estate and sales tax expenditures were \$189,237 this fiscal year.

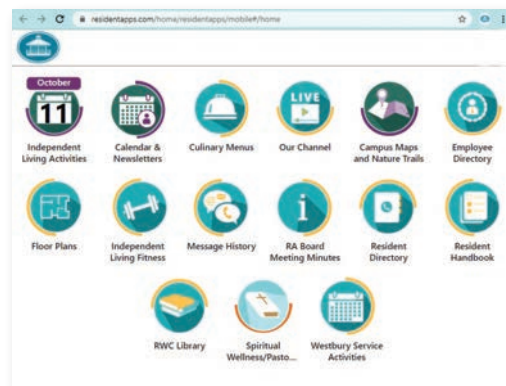

# INNOVATION @RWC

## Touchtown

Touchtown is a new online communication service that keeps our residents connected through a variety of media. All our announcements can be distributed from one place including our in-house Television station! A community app is included in the platform and can be downloaded on your cell phone or tablet so, residents can learn about the latest fitness classes, events, weather and menu from anywhere! Touchtown is Alexa-friendly as well so you can find out the latest news hands free! We are excited about our new advancement in technology and know that it will help promote the quality of life of our residents.



## The Small House

The Small House, made possible by the generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Birdsong, III and the Birdsong Charitable Foundation, is our newest addition to the RWC campus. It is an independent memory care house that promotes person-centered care in a home-style environment. The Small House is the first innovative care solutions of its kind in the Northern Neck area. We are truly grateful for the benevolence of the Birdsongs and know that the Small House will benefit many of those who live with the effects of dementia for years to come.

## Case Study Published by *Leading Age*

In an effort to maintain the quality of life for all of our residents, RWC's Director of Nursing, Mary Ann Hensley and Dementia Care Coordinator, Mary Arthur partnered with Westminster-Canterbury Chesapeake Bay and the Birdsong Corporation to initiate a study using an engagement technology tool called the Birdsong Tablet. The clinical study found an elevation in mood, an increase in cognitive ability, and a reduction in caregiver stress. After implementation of the Tablets as an engagement and redirection tool, staff saw a 76% decrease in antipsychotic medications use among residents. Residents experienced a reduction in social isolation, reduced feelings of loneliness and depression, and a decrease in dementia-related behaviors. 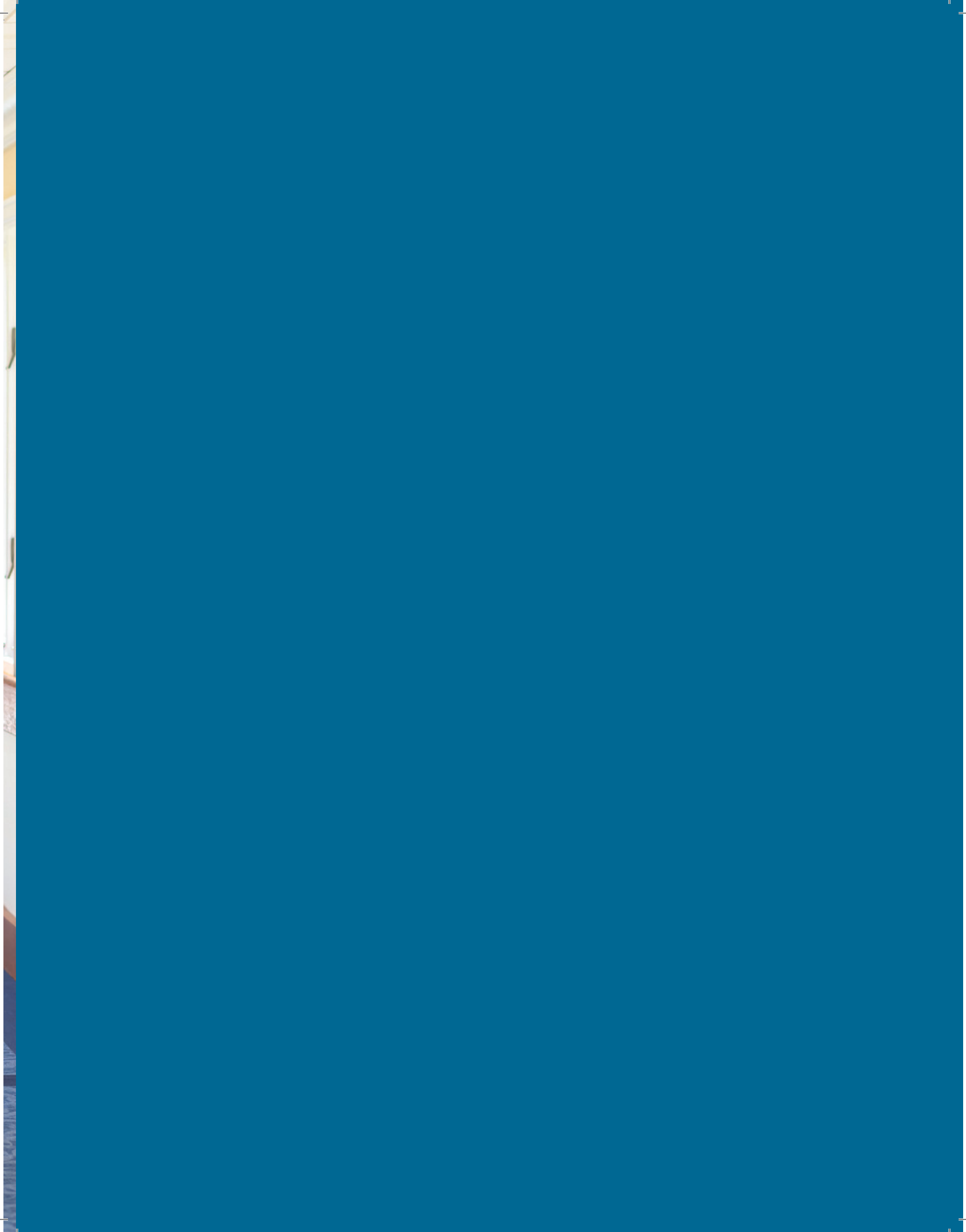
